Umberto Brunelleschi (1879-1949) was a celebrated Italian artist who also led a prolific career in costume and set design, as well as children's book illustrations. During his career, he worked for venues such as the Folies Bergere, the "Theatre du Chatelet" in Paris and La Scala in Milan, and also designed costumes for Josephine Baker.
